FEATURED ARTIST MAUREEN FRITCHEN

"Organic Abstractions" - Maureen Fritchen creates paintings which feel like familiar places, yet are unidentifiable. Her strong horizontals and sensitive color ranges suggest landscapes. Yet they are landscapes which are inside themselves. Each work has its own temperature and atmosphere. Repeated forms and patterns occur in micro and macro worlds. These worlds exist side by side. There is a feeling of the record of an organic timeline in the work. There are fields of growth and decay. There are no void spaces in her work. Every space is quietly activated. There is a play of contrasting elements here: opacity and transparency, hard and soft, light and dark. The overall effect is one of calm. There is a sense of archeology. One feels that each area could be excavated for hidden secrets.

Fritchen's collage, encaustic and sculptural assemblages offer us a chance to enjoy the beauty of imperfection. From her choice of found materials to the application of media the raw quality of the pieces hide the technical craftsmanship.

Fritchen works in what she calls an interchangeable format. She creates many pieces and assembles them to create a larger piece. Fritchen's Six Hundred [Stir Sticks], included in this years WVA's Wisconsin Artists Biennial, is such a piece. Seen from a distance, it appears that this is a tapestry hanging on a wall. Closer inspection reveals something entirely different. As the title implies, the piece is made from 600 (continued from page 1) paint laden stir sticks. The piece is

WISCONSIN ARTISTS BIENNIAL 2014 - by Virgi Driscoll

The opening of the Wisconsin Artists Biennial, 2014 at the new Museum of Wisconsin Art, MOWA, was a huge success. Hundreds of people came out on a snowy evening to join in the festivities of the evening. Appetizers, champagne, cash bar and background music provided additional ambience to a great exhibit and appreciative audience. It was a festive occasion.

The Wisconsin Artists Biennial is one of the most exciting exhibitions sponsored by the Wisconsin Visual Artists. The commitment by WVA to highlight artistic excellence throughout the state has been a trademark of WVA since its existence in 1900. This year exhibiting the art at the new Museum of Wisconsin Art added to the excitement of this event. It is the first statewide art show of Wisconsin artists exhibited in this new building.

The Biennial was open to include artists statewide and all art forms including time-based, multi media art. It was exciting to see the high quality and breadth of art entered in this exhibition. Wisconsin has a strong art base producing works that are highly creative. We can be very proud of our artists. An attempt was made to engage artists who create film and media to enter this show. We had very few entries in this area and none were juried into the exhibition. Perhaps the next Biennial will prove differently to reflect more 21st century art forms.

We did not print a prospectus of this exhibition but rather posted it on the WVA website. Additional publicity to inform artists across the state was sent out repeatedly via e-mail and other well known art web sites. MOWA also posted information on their website and distributed other information. We felt that it was important to be environmentally responsible and go paperless when possible.

Two hundred fifty two artists responded to the call for entries. The juror, Molly Zuckerman Hartung, a Chicago artist and art educator at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago, was very capable in viewing and selected works for the show. The entries were juried via digital images and the awards were selected from the works of art at the museum site. Molly selected 53 artists' art works: nine 3-D and forty-four 2-D art works. The work is exhibited in the main exhibition gallery of MOWA.

FEATURED ARTIST LARRY BOOTH

Although Larry Booth was trained as an architect to create things in the third dimension, he has spent most of his career in the two dimensional world of graphic design and commercial art. His passion for creating things with a third dimension, however, is never far from his mind and can be seen in many of his other artistic endeavors including his unique wall art. As Booth describes it, "A true third dimension transforms wall art into a tactile as well as visual experience. The art begs to be touched and challenges our perception of it as the lighting or our viewing angle changes."

Booth calls his work "TopoArt", or art inspired by the random forces of Nature. It is an art form that draws upon the earth's topography for its inspiration. The work abstractly depicts the sinuous, artistic designs carved into the earth's surface over millions of years by water, wind and tectonic forces. Each piece is based upon an actual landform such as Mt. McKinley or the Grand Canyon. And each color in the art represents a different stratum or elevation within that particular landform.

The three-dimensional pieces are made of wood or, for larger installations, rigid polystyrene. The work utilizes bold colors and multi-leveled surfaces to create shadows, depth and visual mystery that compel the viewer to come closer and explore its tactile dimensions. (continued on page 8)


