FEATURED ARTIST KATHERYN CORBIN

Katheryn's first kiln was built brick by brick next to her house in Lake Geneva, WI. She followed a how-to written by Robert Piepenburg on Raku firing. The chance discovery of Raku defined her future path. At University of Wisconsin Whitewater she fired with salt, garbage soaked with salt and delicate porcelain. Her MA at University of Wisconsin Milwaukee was a series of sawdust fired semi-orbs. MFA work was slab drawings on the floor, wall and pedestal using combinations of slips and glazes.

Katheryn's work is informed by functional ceramic vessels. She has had a career in porcelain dinnerware designed for specific clients and series ordered and sold at American Crafts Council markets as well as seasonal craft fairs. Her figure sculptures are built like hollow jars. She continues glaze exploration and spontaneous brush marks on the surfaces. (continued on pg.4)

IN MEMORY OF WVA MEMBERS

In Memory of Theron Caldwell Ris - by Doug E.L. Haynes

Theron Caldwell Ris passed away on May 7, 2016 at age 84. Theron was a long term member of the Wisconsin Visual Artists, who enthusiastically participated in the exhibitions and activities our organization. She served on several committees of the South Central Chapter including chair of the membership committee, exhibition chair and chapter chair. Theron participated in the Wisconsin Visual Artists' Japanese exchanges in 2000, 2002 and 2005. She had an active exhibition record including participation in the 1995 and 1997 Wisconsin Artists biennials. She also participated in the 1998 WP&S Sesquicentennial at the Charles Allis Museum, Milwaukee.

Artists of sufficient age will remember Theron as a tall thin woman who lived in a distinctive house on a bluff overlooking the Yahara river. The modern home had a silo tower with an observation deck that was filled with kites. There was a detached studio and the home was filled with Theron's ever present dogs.

She will be remembered for her passion, warmth and encouragement to others. Her work was expressive, colorful and usually depicted her favorite subject matter, animals. She used her art to invite the viewer to perceive her subjects with compassion. Her work emphasized each animal's unique spirit. In an artist's statement Theron asked viewers to consider, "the unthinking lack of empathy which my species has for other animals." Theron's fierce advocacy for respect for animals was a central characteristic of her being.

Ris received two art degrees from the University of Wisconsin, Madison; a BS in Fine Arts in 1981 and a an MFA in 1984. From that time forward Theron never put down the brush. Through the years she had over 25 solo shows. Ris continued to paint and share her work up until her death.

She was preceded in death by the father of her children, William L. Caldwell, and her second husband, Hans Ris. She is survived by She is survived by her six children and two stepchildren. A memorial service was held June 19th at the First Unitarian Church in Madison.

In Memory of Lee Ann Kleeman

Lee Ann, age 73, passed away on May 15 at home with her husband at her side. She was born on July 27, 1942 in Oak Park, IL, and grew up in Glen Ellyn, IL. She graduated from Milwaukee Downer College in 1964 with a BA in art. Following college, she spent 2 years as a Peace Corps volunteer in Afghanistan and upon her return to the U.S., resided in Madison, WI where she was an elementary and middle school art teacher in the Madison Public School system from 1970 until her retirement in 1996. She earned her MFA in art metal from UW-Madison. An accomplished fiber artist, she produced hand-stitched ornaments, pins, pendants and large wall pieces, shown in both local and national shows. She won a national award from the Embroiderer's Guild of America. Memorials may be made in her name to Wisconsin Public Radio or Agrace Hospice and Palliative Care.

FEATURED ARTIST SARA WILLADSEN

Sara Willadsen makes pictures that satisfy her curiosity in aesthetics and found materials. Combining these articles with reappropriations of her own work allows Willadsen to employ past patterns and marks as prompts for new structures and environments. The aggressive process used to construct these secretive spaces is kept in balance with the consciousness to know when to stop.

Willadsen received her BA in Fine Art and Graphic Design from Lakeland University in 2010 and her MFA in Painting from Northern Illinois University in 2014. Working mainly with paint and various site-specific found materials, Willadsen's work explores concepts of abstract spaces and structures guided by her surroundings.

Exhibition of the prints will at Rahr-West Museum in August, then at the Hamilton Wood Type & Printing Museum until the beginning of November.
